Financial Report and Approval of Payments:

Ms. Weaver guided the Board through the review of finances (unaudited) as of October 31, 2021. On the Balance Sheet, Cash as of 10/31/2021 was \$2,261,200; this includes cash in the operating accounts, CDs, escrowed funds and the DLP Investment. The school's ending Fund Balance at 10/31/2021 was \$2,042,823, Accounts Payable as of 10/31/2021 was \$173,313, while Accrued Payroll was \$429,413. For the 4 months ending 10/31/2021, the school had an operating surplus of \$168,534 compared to a budgeted YTD surplus of \$310,047, and is currently projecting a year-end operating surplus of \$664,877.

Ms. Weaver called for a motion to approve the fiscal year financial report ending October 31st, 2021 and for the list of bills to be paid. Motion was made by Mr. Lopez seconded by Mr. Santana. Motion was passed unanimously.

Old Business

• **Renovation Update** - Meetings are held every two weeks to go over progress and change orders as needed. The nurse office will be worked on during the thanksgiving holiday. A potential bid

will be needed for the alarm system. Still waiting on feedback from a fire marshal that needs to come and evaluate if the current system could be grandfather in if the facility space is needs to be separate from rest of the building.

- COVID-19 Vaccination Policy The school has been following the safety protocols in regards to Covid-19 as it was presented to the Pennsylvania Department of Education just as the Bethlehem Area School District is doing. The school at this time will hold on passing this policy considering all the comments from the staff survey. Vaccination is highly encouraged for all staff.
 - ✓ **Fiscal Planning -** Fulton Bank was informed of the intent of the school 7th Grade 04/12/2022 Jacobsburg Environmental Center
- to use the 250K line of credit. DLP was also informed of the possible withdrawer of 250K from the account if needed in the beginning of December 2021.
- **Property Tax Exemption Application -** The property tax exemption was received by our office Friday October 29, 2021 and return to the McMain office signed by November 1, 2021.

New Business

- Potential Property Tax Liability The potential tax liability the school would have to pay if not granted the retroactive exemption could possibly be \$7,639.88. The McMain Law will take the payment responsibility to pay if this is due for lack of summitting the tax exemption application when it was due.
- Annual Financial Report 2020-2021- Report completed by Charter Choices was available to the board for review and given to School Secretary and CEO/COO for signatures.

Mr. Lopez called for a motion to approve the **2020-2021 Annual Financial Report** as presented for submission. Motion was seconded by Mr. Paulino. Motion was accepted unanimously.

This Summary and Management Report presents information we believe is important to you as members of the school board. We encourage you to review the sections of this report and we would be pleased to furnish additional information as requested.

Monthly financials are intended to provide a snapshot of the financials as of a specific point in time. As a result, they are subject to variances due to timing – the most common example is when invoices are received after the financials are prepared.

- Projected Operating Net Income at November 30 = \$289K (exclusive of Building Acquisition)
- Fund Balance (Assigned + Unassigned) = \$1.8M

- The school's Cash Balance decreased slightly to \$1,594,832 at November 30th as the school awaits Local, State and Federal receipts.
- Total Current Liabilities on November 30, 2021 represent a \$444,969 increase since June 30th due to the addition of monthly mortgage payments (partially offset by the Summer payout of Accrued Payroll).

• The building purchase occurred in August and is reflected as a Fixed Asset and as a Long-Term Liability on the Balance Sheet. It is also shown on the Budget-to-Actual report at the bottom in a separate section.

- Local Revenues of \$2,561,639 are several percentage points over the YTD budgeted amount as the school has maintained healthy enrollment and tuition rates have increased. State and Federal revenues (Titled Funds, ESSER II, etc.) will be recognized later in the year when PDE begins issuing payments.
 - Total Expenses are slightly over budget (by \$161K) due to offsetting variances on Personnel, Property Services, Instructional Supplies and the replacement of Rental Costs with Debt Service payments.
 - The school currently projects a year-end Operating Surplus of \$289,401 (exclusive of the Building Acquisition) and will utilize nearly \$1.5M in COVID-relief funding (ESSER II, ARP ESSER) in FY22.

3. Financial Updates with Potential Impacts on the PA Charter School Community

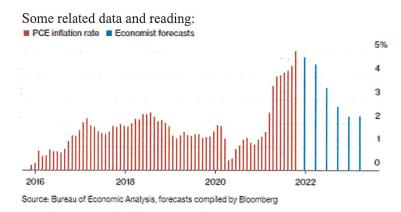
Felt most painfully this school year in terms of staff turnover and the challenge of filling vacancies, charter schools are not immune to broader issues affecting the economy. From a financial perspective, <u>inflation is causing problems for schools now – and possibly even more so as we look ahead to next year's budgets.</u>

There is no shortage of media coverage of the inflation dynamic, but we want to encourage school leaders and Boards to prepare – that is: prepare, not panic – for the impacts of inflation on 22-23 budget planning, as well as for current-year symptoms of that inflationary impact.

For the current year, schools are seeing – or might expect to see – direct increases in certain cost categories, including: external services for which prices are not contractually fixed; various facility costs, such as utilities or construction (materials and labor); technology hardware; classroom and administrative supplies; rates for substitute teachers or services; staff retention/morale bonuses; and higher starting salaries for full-time hires. Thankfully, however, a school's largest expenditures – typically salaries, benefits and lease/mortgage costs – were effectively locked in by the nature of agreements or contracts and thus have not jumped during the year. We cannot expect that dynamic to hold at the turn of the next fiscal year.

As we prepare for the 22-23 school year budget, we should monitor staffing conditions locally to make sure our salary increase assumptions (2-3% average raises historically) are realistic to maintain staff. While it is too early to predict any change in health benefit costs for next year, we should assume – due to a rebound in utilization rates that fell during 2020 due to COVID restrictions – increases here as well. Even if higher costs in other categories prove to be temporary or level out, the nature of personnel costs as the largest single category in your school's budget means we must be prepared to think creatively or to consider trade-offs to meet these financial challenges.

We are fortunate to have elevated Federal funding (ESSER 2, ARP ESSER) to help offset some or all of these costs in 22-23, but we must also prepare for how to operate the school at a higher cost even beyond the timeline when Federal funds may be reduced to earlier levels. We look forward to working with you in the coming months to navigate these issues.
